Bannister, who was the vice president of the board, gave Mr. Dively permission, after Mr. Dively asked him, to do about \$4,000.00 or \$4,500.00 worth of dredging. And Mr. Bannister took it upon himself to approve that. There was no board meeting. There was no vote. There was no nothing. That made me crazy because that's not how you do

So, I immediately protested. The next board meeting I believe I attended, there was a motion and a vote that they would never do that

again. Then, I, being the bookkeeper, I put in the books that we paid that money for dredging. At the next meeting, I was contested, and they said, "No, that needs to be shoreline restoration." I said, "Well, the word that was given to me was dredging and using shoreline restoration is an attempt to make it look different to the DEP if they ever looked at it."

I also got reamed out for contacting the DEP and trying to do things decently and in order by almost the entire board, especially by Mr. Dively, who later went to the DEP on some other issue that I can't even reflect on because I was gone then. So, things were getting ugly in my opinion. Then, I did a 990 form. And the 990 form and asked if there is any conflicts of interest. That was definitely a conflict of interest in my opinion. So, I put it in the 990.

They refused to file it, had it redone, and took that out. And then,

I resigned from the board because I called our DNO insurance carrier agent and asked him if the board is acting inappropriately, does that insurance cover you. And his answer was if they're truly acting inappropriately, no, it should not cover you. I said fine. I called Larry Rossage and I resigned from the board. And that was also a very unpleasant phone call because I said point blank, "Things are going on that aren't appropriate."

And I said, "There is another excavator on our lake named Greg Must. He's been there forever. And he's done work for the lake and he's a good guy." And I said, "You know, that deal with Dan Dively on the dredging? What do you think Greg Must would think of that?" And Larry Rossage's exact words were, "I don't give a shit what Greg Must thinks." And then, I knew it was time for me to go because the board had gone down a very bad path.

1 Q. Would you consider this a

- 2 difference of opinion?
- A. No. It's absolutely not. It's
- 4 ethics.
- 5 Q. What ethics?
- 6 A. You don't self-deal. You don't




